***In the Shadow of Blackbirds* by Cat Winters.** In 1918, the world seems on the verge of apocalypse. Americans roam the streets in gauze masks to ward off the deadly Spanish influenza, and the government ships young men to the front lines of a brutal war. Sixteen-year-old Mary Shelley Black watches as desperate mourners flock to séances and spirit photographers for comfort, but she herself has never believed in ghosts.



***The Fairy Ring, or, Elsie and Frances Fool the World* by Mary Losure.** In England during the early 20th Century, two girls create fake photographs of fairies that later fool hundreds of people into believing that fairies exist. This true story describes how these girls created the images, why they caused so many to believe they were genuine, and how Arthur Conan Doyle reacted when he saw them for the first time.



***The Light (Morpheus Road series)* by D.J. MacHale.** Sixteen-year-old Marshall Seaver is expecting a boring summer when his best friend goes away, but instead he finds himself haunted--and hunted--by ghosts that want something from him that he cannot decipher.



***The Haunting of Sunshine Girl* by Paige McKenzie with Alyssa Sheinmel.** Moving from Texas to Washington, Sunshine, an adopted sixteen-year-old, discovers that her new home is haunted and that the ghosts may have revelations about her past. From the moment they arrive, Sunshine feels her world darken with an eeriness she cannot place.



***A Monster Calls* by Patrick Ness.** Thirteen-year-old Conor awakens one night to find a monster outside his bedroom window, but not the one from the recurring nightmare that began when his mother became ill--an ancient, wild creature that wants him to face truth and loss.



***City of Ghosts* by Victoria Schwab.** Ever since she drowned and survived, Cass has walked the line between the world of the living and the dead, with the ability to pull back the Veil that separates them. Her best friend is now a ghost, and her parents are hosting a TV show about the world's most haunted places. Edinburgh, Scotland, the first location is where Cass meets someone else who has her same ability.



***The Cure for Dreaming* by Cat Winters.** In Portland, Oregon, in 1900, seventeen-year-old Olivia Mead, a suffragist, is hypnotized by the intriguing young Henri Reverie, who is paid by her father to make her more docile and womanly but who, instead, gives her the ability to see people's true natures, while she secretly continues fighting for women's rights.
